SHIP CLEANLINESS AND WASTE WATER MANAGEMENT DIRECTIVE

Local Notice to Mariners 03/2014 is cancelled.

Masters are advised that the Esperance Port restricts wastewater discharges. "Unless authorised by a member of staff of the port authority, the Master of a vessel must not cause or permit any waste water or waste substances of any kind to be discharged from the vessel onto any part of a wharf or into the waters of a port."

This applies to:

- Dry bulk cargo residues, hold cleaning and deck washings
- Sewage
- Oil, bilge water and oily water and
- Grey water and other wastewaters;
- Ballast Waters laden with sediment particulates or other contaminants

If the vessel is unable to comply, the discharge of low volumes of waste waters can be practically conducted if, the Ship's Master contracts a Controlled Waste Carrier in Esperance to arrange collection and disposal. Contact must be made in advance to ensure the correct fittings can be

arranged to allow collection of this waste. Ship's Masters are required to declare their intention and ability to comply with this directive. Discharge of larger volumes of waste waters such as contaminated ballast waters may not be practical and pre-planning before arrival is suggested as the best means of control.

Non Compliance with this directive may result in prosecution of the ships Master under Australian Marine Orders and Environmental Legislation.
